### **INFORMATION FOR APPLICANTS**

The Visiting Fellowship Program at the ANU Centre for European Studies is part of the Centre's mission to promote research, education and dialogue between Europe and Australia. The Visiting Fellowship Program is specifically aimed at supporting and hosting local and international scholars wishing to undertake research at the Australian National University.

#### **Research themes:**

Each year the ANU Centre for European Studies and the Research School of Humanities announce broad research themes. Applications from scholars interested in these themes from any discipline are welcome. Please note that while priority is accorded to applications addressing these themes, proposals outside these themes will also be considered. The broad Theme for 2010 is '*Europe and the Law*', within which the following projects are being developed:

- Constitutionalism, Rights and the Judicial Role
- Refugee Protection
- Implementing and Enforcing International Law
- Islam and Rights in Europe
- Environmental Cooperation (especially renewable energy)
- Supranationalism and Federalism
- Citizenship, Migration and Identity
- The EU in the Asia-Pacific

#### **Conditions of Fellowship:**

If successful, Visiting Fellows must be in residence at the Australian National University throughout the duration of their fellowship.

The Visiting Fellowship offer does not constitute an offer of employment with the University.

Visiting Fellows are provided with office space and a networked computer providing access to the Internet and email. The Centre also provides some administrative support. In addition, Visiting Fellows are welcome to make use of the University's libraries.

Visiting Fellows are invited to participate in the Centre's outreach and teaching activities, including the seminar series, roundtables, workshops, conferences, the European Studies Summer School and the Graduate Intensive Course.

## TYPES OF FELLOWSHIP

### *Visiting Fellow (with grant)*

This Fellowship is for a period between one and six months. The grants can be used towards economy airfares and accommodation for the Visiting Fellow. The maximum contribution for travel is AUD\$3,500. This financial assistance is not a salary replacement.

### *Visiting Fellow (with partial grant)*

This Fellowship is intended for scholars within Australia and New Zealand who wish to undertake research at the Centre. The grant is to assist with travel expenses.

### *Visiting Fellow (without grant)*

Academic staff from The Australian National University, other universities and institutions may apply to use the facilities at the Centre during periods of research leave (e.g. sabbatical).

### *Visitor*

Short-term visitors, who wish to participate in the ANU Centre for European Studies' program of activities, may apply at any time to visit the Centre. Participants may apply for reimbursement of travel and/or accommodation costs.

### *Visiting Scholar*

This scholarship of up to \$5000 is aimed at current PhD students and early-career academics within two years of the completion of their doctoral studies. This financial assistance is for travel and accommodation.

## ABOUT THE CENTRE

The Centre was established in 2001 as a joint initiative of the ANU and the European Union. It is a small interdisciplinary research centre supporting primarily postdoctoral and doctoral research, and visiting scholars working in the field of EU and comparative studies concerning Australia and Europe. The Centre is located at 1 Liversidge Street, on the Acton Peninsula at The Australian National University, Canberra, Australia.
